


Niihama City

Niihama ranked 9th for Quality of Life by Housewives in Japan. (from Asahi Shimbun, June 7)

Niihama was ranked 9th and Matsuyama 5th in a survey asking: "Are you happy living in your city as a housewife?" It was carried out by Gakken Publishing in Tokyo. The two cities were ranked No.1 and No.2 in Shikoku. Both cities received high scores for happiness from the aspect of "the family". So young housewives must be satisfied with their lives.

The survey was conducted last April when the first issue of a new magazine was launched. Out of the 813 local city governments in Japan and the 23 wards of Tokyo, 104 were selected to find out whether housewives feel happy regarding food, clothing, housing and child rearing. Then questionnaires were sent out to 4793 housewives aged between 20 and 49. The following 5 points were graded: *living *family *money *food & health and *goods & hobbies.

Matsuyama received a high mark with regard to *family. Housewives seem to enjoy good relationships with other mothers and their family members.

Niihama got good grades in the following three areas, *family *food & health and *goods & hobbies. Many answered, "I can decide many things related to family matters." It shows that their family members are generally nice to them and put high value on their work as housewives.

Homestay and Work at a Fisherman's House For 3 nights and 4 days (From Ehime Shimbun)

'Uwajima Komobuchi Fisherman's Work' started last March. You can stay at fisherman's house and help with their work. Komobuchi is famous for its aquaculture. This project is not well known yet but several groups of people have taken part in it and have been satisfied with the experience. Komobuchi is a village with a population of about 400. It is located on the western tip of the Miura Peninsula, which protrudes into the Uwa Sea. They live on fish breeding, pearl farming and iwagaki oyster farming,

which has begun to replace slow pearl farming. *Fisherman's Work* aims to promote aquaculture and to secure and foster the future of the industry. Anyone who is between 18 and 69 years old and can do physical work is eligible to apply. They can stay for 3 nights and 4 days at fisherman's home for either pearl farming or oyster farming. A couple from Kyoto, Asaichi Matsuira (67) and his wife Takako (65) stayed at Shinga Ikezoe's (56), pearl farm, at the end of April. They worked on a raft taking the old oysters off the cages or ropes and replacing them with new/younger oysters to use for growing pearls, and cleaning the shells.

Asaichi said, "I gave it a try to widen my horizons. Now I understand how challenging this work is." Takako said, "I am happy to talk with the local people. We cannot have such an opportunity on the usual sightseeing tour." She also said, "All the food I had was very delicious. ONE POINT JAPANESE

"いためる、~いため、煮る"

A:最近、あまり 外食しませんね。Saikin amari gaishoku shimasen ne.

(Recently you haven't eaten out much, have you?)

B: ええ、ほとんど 自炊しています。 Ee, hotondo jisui shiteimasu.

(That's right. I cook for myself most of the time.)

A: 昨日は 何を 作ったんですか。Kinō wa nani o tsukuttan desu ka.

(What did you cook yesterday?)

B:<u>野菜いため</u>です。<u>近</u>所の 人に たくさん 野菜を もらったので。

Yasai itame desu. Kinjo no hito ni takusan yasai o moratta node.

(Stir-fried vegetables. I got a lot of vegetables from a neighbor.)

A: 今日は? Kyō wa? (What about today?)

B: 牛丼と トマトサラダです。Gyūdon to tomato sarada desu-(Gyudon and tomato salad.)

A: 牛丼が 作れるんですか。Gyūdon ga tsukurerun desu ka. (Can you make gyudon?)

B:ええ。簡単だし、吉野家のより 安く できますよ。

Ee. Kantan da shi, Yoshinoya no yori yasuku dekimasu yo.

(Yes. It is easy and you can make it cheaper than Yoshinoya.)

≪牛丼の作り方≫ 《 How to make Gyudon 》

1. 牛肉と 薄切りに した 玉ねぎを 油で <u>いためる</u>。

Gyūniku to usugiri ni shita tamanegi o abura de itameru.

(Saute beef and thin-sliced onion in oil.)

2. ①の たれを 入れて 5~6分 *煮る*。

①no tare o irete goroppun niru.

(Add sauce ① and simmer for five or six minutes.)

3. 2を どんぶりに 入れた ご飯の 正に のせて、山東上がり。

2o donburi ni ireta gohan no ue ni nosete, dekiagari.

(Put 2 on top of rice in a bowl and it's finished!)

4. <u>煮すぎない</u>のが コツです。Nisuginai no ga kotsu desu.

(The trick is not to simmer it too much.)

<材料>zairyo <ingredients>

学園 150g (薄切り) beef 150g (sliced)

エねぎ 1/2個 ごはん 2杯分 onion a half rice two

bowls

① 「・水 カップ 1/2 ・酒 大さじ1(15cc)・しょう油 大さじ1

・砂糖 小さじ1 ・みそ 少々

- half a cup of water a tablespoon of sake (15cc)
